



























A NOTE FROM **OUR LEADERS**



PATRICK TILLMAN

ATHLETE. SCHOLAR. SOLDIER. LEADER.

Pat was born in 1976 in San Jose, California. He led his high school team to a championship after he was told he was too small to ever play football. Arizona State University recognized Pat's potential with a scholarship to play as a linebacker for the Sun Devils. What Pat lacked in size, he more than made up for in intensity—he led ASU to the 1997 Rose Bowl after an undefeated season. Between games, Pat earned a B.S. in Marketing, graduating Summa Cum Laude.

The Arizona Cardinals selected Pat in the 7th round of the 1998 NFL Draft. Despite skepticism about his ability, he became the team's starting safety and broke the franchise record for tackles in 2000 with 224. However, Pat's NFL success did not go to his head. He drove to games in the same beat-up truck he had in college. In the off-season, he challenged himself with marathons and triathlons while pursuing a master's degree in history from ASU. He volunteered with Boys and Girls Clubs, the March of Dimes, and local schools.

In the spring of 2002, Pat married his high school love, Marie. He then decided to place his NFL career on hold, turning down a \$3.6 million contract to enlist in the U.S. Army. Pat and his brother Kevin joined the U.S. Army that July, committing to a three-year term. They were assigned to the second battalion of the 75th Ranger Regiment, and served tours in Iraq in 2003 and in Afghanistan in 2004. On April 22, 2004, Pat's unit was ambushed. His heroic efforts to provide cover for fellow soldiers led to his tragic death via fratricide.

While the story of Pat's death may have been more publicized, it is Pat's life, principles and service that are his true legacy—and this foundation's inspiration.

WHO WE ARE

Family and friends established the Pat Tillman Foundation (PTF) following Pat's death in April 2004 while he was serving with the 75th Ranger Regiment in Afghanistan. Through the Tillman Scholars program, PTF is building the leading fellowship program for military veterans and spouses. Founded in 2008, the program supports active-duty service members, veterans and their spouses with academic scholarships, a national network and professional development opportunities, so they are empowered to make an impact at home and around the world. These Tillman Scholars are already making a difference in the fields of medicine, law, business, technology, education, the arts and more. 
GREG FREISINGER

After 9/11, Greg Freisinger answered the call to serve as an Army officer, deploying with the 84th Engineer Battalion to Iraq and Southeast Asia. Following active-duty, he earned his Ph.D. as a Tillman Scholar in Biomechanical Engineering at The Ohio State University. Now, Greg is teaching the next generation of Army officers at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point. As an assistant professor, he is advancing research on human performance and technology to improve the lives of soldiers in combat and injured veterans at home.











SCHOLARSHIP


Since its inception, the Tillman Scholar Program has evolved into a world-class community of military veterans and spouses, accepting less than 5% of applicants based exclusively on merit and potential for impact. PTF made a \$1.1 million lifetime commitment to the 2017 Class of Tillman Scholars, from a pool of approximately 2,100 applications.











Sam Innocent joined the military in 2004 as a path to pursue higher education. Now, as a veteran specialist for a workforce development company, Sam collaborates with government agencies to develop workforce programs. He is a passionate advocate for quality education, jobs and affordable healthcare in low-income neighborhoods like his own in Brownsville, Brooklyn. Appointed as the Vice Chair of the Veterans' Advisory Board for the Commissioner of Veterans' Affairs, he has also played a role in several legislative successes for veterans in New York City.



NETWORK

The Regional Foundation Captain (RFC) program, a network of dedicated and resourced Tillman Scholars, accelerates the growth, effectiveness, and connectedness of Tillman Scholars both with one another and with their communities. Tillman Scholars have proven to be vital resources to one another: as professional references, as mentors to one another, and as organization and project leaders and collaborators. RFC's are Tillman Scholars who volunteer to serve as ambassadors of the Tillman Scholars program.









PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Tillman Scholars may apply for a mini-grant up to \$1,000 to support a professional development opportunity. These mini-grants are provided for professional development opportunities including conferences, workshops, training, and certifications. To date, over 50 Tillman Scholars have participated in rewarding opportunities across the country.










Through a professional development opportunity, Adrian traveled to and advised his hometown of Shreveport, LA to advocate for the social and economic benefits of pursuing tech initiatives, such as a city owned broadband network. Adrian met with Mayor Ollie Tyler and the City Council where he presented the benefits of this technology shift. Mayor Tyler asked Adrian to return and advise the city on tech initiatives and to sit in on official infrastructure meetings. Since his visit, he has assisted the city in acquiring grant funding and has been published in Wired Magazine.

















Jonny's desire to protect those who cannot protect themselves galvanized him to enlist in the Navy at age 18. He found his passion in medicine during his service as a Naval Special Warfare Medic in the Iraq War, where he was inspired by the skill and devotion of the physicians who saved his teammates' lives.



Inspired by the sacrifices of his teammates, Jonny is driven to lead his life in a way that may leave a contributing mark in this world. In 2017, NASA selected him from 18,000 applicants to continue his passion for service, education and scientific advancement as an Astronaut Candidate. He reported for duty in August 2017.



At Tillman Honors, we were proud to recognize leaders within our community for their remarkable civic contributions, extraordinary fortitude and spirit of service. This year, we were honored to present the Champion Award to former Congresswoman Gabrielle Giffords and Captain Mark Kelly for their lifelong commitment to public service, and the Make Your Mark Award to 2010 Tillman Scholar Chris Roessner, screenwriter and executive producer of Sand Castle. Tillman Honors also showcased impact talks by three Tillman Scholars who, in their own unique ways, are making their mark to write the story of a better future for our country and communities.

Tillman Scholar Chris Roessner, Screenwriter & Filmmaker





After serving as a Civil Affairs soldier and later an Army reservist while attending the University of Southern California, Chris Roessner wrote a screenplay about his experience on deployment in Iraq during Operation Iraqi Freedom. "Sand Castle", as the work came to be known, made the 2012 Black List of promising screenplays, debuted at Cannes to critical acclaim, and was released exclusively by Netflix in 2017 to depict the human experience at war.













PAT'S RUN

From the first event held in 2005 with 5,000 participants, Pat's Run has grown into the largest run in the nation to honor a fallen soldier and support the Tillman Scholars.

In 2017, 28,000 runners signed up to participate in the 4.2 mile Run/Walk in Tempe, AZ. Over 75 Tillman Scholars led the race corrals and rallied support for our mission. Through our partnership with the Arizona State University Alumni Association, 4.2 mile Honor Runs were held on the same day in over 30 cities across the country.











TEAM TILLMAN

Team Tillman keeps Pat's passion and intensity alive while inspiring others to live up to their potential. A community of everyday athletes, members of Team Tillman participate as a team or individually in marathons, half-marathons, triathlons, cycling and other athletic events to honor Pat. To date, Team Tillman has raised over \$1.3 million to fund the Tillman Scholar program.



As a Tillman scholar, the surviving spouse of a military veteran, and mother of two children, one of whom is autistic, Heather Barnett wears many hats.



Heather is interested in designing programs equipped with proper supports, accommodations and trained personnel that will enable those who require more assistance to complete degree programs and find suitable employment that fits their skillset. Her passion for service drives her fight for better educational opportunities for her son and other students like him.

Shortly following her son's diagnoses, Heather signed up for a marathon and has been running in races ever since. Most recently, Heather served as the captain for Team Tillman in the Bank of America Chicago Marathon in October, 2017.





A 15-year Army veteran, Moe Espino proudly served with 7th and 20th Special Forces Groups as a Special Forces Medical Sergeant on tours to Iraq, Afghanistan, and multiple countries in Central and South America. While on activeduty, Moe deployed three times as a full-time student, and pushed himself to earn his bachelor's degree and apply to medical school. In May 2017, Moe graduated with honors from Campbell University School of Osteopathic Medicine. After his residency, he plans to return home to rural Texas and serve as a local physician, promoting a positive message of health and wellness.


